Research in auditory processing at UCL

University College London (UCL) is aiming to investigate the effect of ageing on motor control in speech. Researchers would like to invite around 10 monolingual British English speakers, 65-80 years old, to participate in their studies. Before the study, the researchers would ask you to complete a general background information questionnaire. The study itself involves one or two visits to UCL's lab in Chandler House, WC1N 1PF.
