## Are You a Chess Player or Would You Like to Learn?

After two successful Zoom meetings, interest has grown amongst members in all parts of the UK to start up a **u3a** Chess Network. Its overall aim is to promote the study and playing of the game in both local **u3a**s and nationally on websites and via Zoom.

Chess, unlike bridge, has never flourished in the **u3a**, probably because of its reputation as a difficult, complex game, played in silence. But the rules are straightforward and easy to grasp and, after a short while, interesting, thought-provoking games can be played. We've also realised in the last few years that a chess club can be sociable, where the intention is to explore the theory, play well but also enjoy the game and meet other people. Playing chess improves concentration, memory, decision-making and spatial comprehension – a real advantage for all of us in **u3a**.

In September a nation-wide **u3a** Chess League will be set up which will be available to members of all abilities, from learners to experts. Its objectives are to:

- help and encourage new local chess clubs
- collect, and make readily available, information relevant to u3a chess players and clubs
- encourage Zoom or online u3a chess groups or leagues.
