Group News

Badminton: New Group

Badminton is an easy sport for those of an older age, though fitness levels need to be reasonable. So, if you want to get some exercise in an enjoyable way and to play a sport in a friendly, 'competitive' environment, with likeminded people, you might be interested in joining Graeme Campbell's proposed new Kingston u3a Badminton group.

If the interest is there, then the proposal would be to hire a court or two, depending on numbers (and also court availability), at Tolworth Recreation Centre in Fullers Way North, KT6 7LQ. A suggested day and time would be Wednesday or Thursday at 10.30am or 11.30am for an hour. The cost of court hire is £21.50 an hour. This would be split on a weekly basis between those playing. As an example, if 11 said they were playing, two courts would then be booked for the hour and the cost of £43 would be split between 11 players – approximately £4 each.

Depending on numbers, we would play either singles, doubles or mixed doubles and, to keep rotating (so there isn't too much sitting around!) would play games to either 11 or 15 points. You would not necessarily be playing all the time, depending on numbers. Availability for the following week would be ascertained on a weekly basis via a WhatsApp group set up for that purpose and courts booked for the following week accordingly.

You would need to provide your own racquet and wear suitable trainers with non-marking, non-slip soles.
